

## DOUGLAS G. LICHTMAN

Doug Lichtman is a Professor of Law at the University of Chicago School of Law. Specific areas of expertise include patent, copyright, trademark; the regulation of broadcast, cable, telephone, and Internet infrastructure; antitrust; and a variety of issues related to technology startups and the Internet.

Lichtman's research has been featured in the *Journal of Law and Economics*, the *Journal of Legal Studies*, and the *Harvard Business Review*. He is co-author of *Telecommunications Law and Policy*, the leading casebook on the federal regulatory regimes applicable to broadcast television, radio, cable, telephone, and the Internet. He is also an Editor at the *Journal of Law & Economics*. Lichtman has given invited talks at numerous conferences and institutions, including presentations at Harvard, Yale, Stanford, NYU, Duke, Chicago, and the University of California at Berkeley. He regularly works with the mass media, offering legal commentary to news organizations including CNN, NPR, and the *Chicago Tribune*.

Professor Lichtman has undergraduate degrees in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science, both earned from Duke University, and a J.D. from Yale Law School. He joined the University of Chicago faculty in 1998 and was tenured in 2001.
